1. Safety Precautions

Before using the **EzScope 101** for the first time, please read this entire Operation Manual carefully. To guarantee problem free, safe operation of the **EzScope 101**, it is essential to observe the following section.

1.1 Intended Use

This instrument is intended to be used by trained personnel to perform live-cell imaging. In this Manual we assume the user to have knowledge of basic laboratory procedures and cell cultures.

1.2 General Instrument Safety

PHYSICAL INJURY HAZARD. Using the instrument in a manner not specified by Blue-Ray

Biotech may result in personal injury or damage to the instrument.

1.2.1 Transportation and Storage

This **instrument** should be transported and stored in an environment with a temperature of -20 - 60 °C, relative humidity 20 - 80%.

1.2.2 Installation and Operation

- 1. Do not use the device in a potentially explosive environment or with potentially explosive chemicals.
- 2. Avoid placing the device in direct sunlight.
- 3. Install the device inside a functional incubation chamber with a temperature of 4 42 °C, relative humidity $\leq 95\%$ (non-condensing).
- 4. Choose a flat, stable surface capable of bearing the weight of the device.
- 5. Make sure the power source conforms to the required power supply specifications.
- 6. To avoid electric shock, make sure the device is plugged into a grounded electrical outlet.
- 7. Do not allow water or any foreign objects to enter the various openings of the device.

1.2.3 Cleaning, Decontaminating, and Servicing the Instrument

Before using a cleaning or decontamination method other than those recommended by the manufacturer, verify with the manufacturer that the proposed method will not damage the equipment.

Switch off and unplug the device before cleaning, servicing, or replacing the fuses.

Repairs should be carried out by authorized service personnel only.

1.2.4 Instructions for Removal From Use, Transportation, or Disposal

Do not dispose of this product as unsorted municipal waste. Follow local municipal waste ordinances for proper disposal provisions to reduce the environmental impact of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE).

2. General Description


The **EzScope 101** is a compact, specialized inverted brightfield microscope that is designed to be operated inside the incubation chamber for live cell observation and documentation. It is equipped with a white LED light and exchangeable objective lenses that enable the user to monitor and record the live cell status in the incubator.

2.1 Features

- White LED illumination.
- 10x/20x exchangeable objective lens.
- Motorized focusing.
- 130MP high quality camera.
- Up to 4-unit daisy chain connection.
- Robust and modern outlook design.
- Simple and user-friendly graphical interface.
- Captures single image or multiple images via time-lapse methods.
- Image editing, annotation, measuring, and analysis.
- Converts the time-lapse image series to a video clip.




Figure 2. Rear View

3. Getting Started

3.1 Unpacking

Open the **EzScope 101** package and confirm that all items below are included:

- EzScope 101 Unit x 1 with 10x Objective Lens
- Quick Guide x 1
- Warranty Card x 1
- USB Flash Drive x 1 (Containing EzCapture Software and Operation Manual)
- LED Lamp Arm x 1 (with 2 Fixation Screws and Hex Wrench x 1)
- DC 5V Power Adaptor x 1
- USB Data Cable x 1

If there are any items missing, damaged, or any incorrect items in the package, please contact your local Blue-Ray Biotech's distributor or sales representative immediately.

3.2 Initial Setup

3.2.1 LED Lamp Arm Installation




Figure 3. Installation of the LED Lamp Arm

Plug the mini USB of the LED Lamp Arm into the mini USB port of the EzScope. Tighten 2 screws with the hex wrench.

3.2.2 Cable Connection




Figure 4. Back Connection Panel

3.2.3 EzCapture Software Installation

PC Requirement: i3 CPU with 4 GB RAM, Windows 10 OS. i5 CPU with 8GB RAM for multiple unit connection.

To install EzCapture, run the setup.exe in the EzCapture folder. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish the installation.

To launch the EzCapture software, select EzCapture from the Windows start menu or double click on the EzCapture Icon on the Desktop

3.2.4 Setting up the System

Before placing the EzScope 101 inside the incubator, remove the lens cap and clean the device with a lint free cloth or KimwipeTM soaked with 70% ethanol alcohol.

Note

Do not use acetone to clean the device or autoclave the device.

• Cable Placement

Your incubator may have a cable port in the back.




Figure 5. Cable Placement

If so, please guide the USB cable and the power cable through it (Figure 5a below).

If no cable port is present, place the cables between the glass inner door and the gasket of the incubator (Figure 5b below). Keep the cables free from the hinges to prevent damage to the cables.

Temperature Equilibrium

Note

DO NOT plug the power adaptor to the power outlet at this stage.

Due to the temperature difference between the device and the environment inside the incubator, condensation may occur on the device. To prevent damage to the device, please allow the device to be set inside the incubator for more than 1 hour before you plug the power adaptor into power outlet. This may also help to reduce temperature fluctuation to your cells when you put your culture vessel on the stage of the device.

3.2.5 Vessel Placement

Please place the EzScope 101 in the incubator with the logo facing the operator. By doing this, the displayed image moves in the same direction when the vessel is moved on the EzScope 101's stage.

4. Using EzCapture Software

Double click on the EzCapture icon on the desktop (or other chosen location) of PC or laptop to open the EzCapture software. There are two modes in EzCapture, **Live View Mode** and **Image**

View Mode.

When one EzScope unit is connected to the computer, **Live View Mode** will be displayed. If the EzScope unit is not connected to the computer, **Image View Mode** will be displayed when you open the EzCapture software.

4.1 Live View Mode

EzCapture software will search for any connected EzScope units and display a Live View Image of connected units.

Click on the connected unit's tab, and the live view mode will be displayed (Figure 6).

• Status

It shows the connection status between the EzScope and the computer.

• Connected Unit

On the connected unit bar, it shows all connected EzScope devices or opened images. To monitor or control any EzScope devices, you can click a device name shown on the connected unit bar. The live view image of the device will show in the **Live View Window**.

• Live View Window

Place a culture vessel on the EzScope's sample stage to begin. A live view image of the cells will be visible in the Live View Window (Figure 6). To obtain the best quality of the image, you can adjust image tools shown on the **Control Panel**.

Control Panel

On the Control Panel, tools described below are provided to adjust your image.

> LED

Turn on/off the LED illumination or set the illumination intensity.

Focus

For coarse focusing, move the sliding bar directly.
For fine focusing, click or hold on the left or right adjustment button <
The home icon
can be used to bring the lens to the lowest home position.

Exposure

Check the **Auto** box to enable auto exposure. The optimum exposure time is displayed next to the **Auto** box. You can uncheck the **Auto** box to disable the auto exposure and adjust the exposure time by moving the sliding bar or clicking on the left and right adjustment button $\triangleleft \triangleright$.

Display

The Display function provides digital zoom in/out when you need to check the details of an image or view the whole image.

The digital zoom level of the displayed live view image can be adjusted by moving the sliding bar or clicking on the left and right adjustment button \triangleleft \triangleright .

Time-lapse Photography

You can configure your time-lapse sequence capturing parameter here. Please refer to *Section 4.3.1* for further information.

Timestamp

Check to enable the timestamp on the live view image and on the captured images.

> Flat-Field Correction

For better image quality, check the Flat-Field Correction button to enable the function. This function provides background correction based on saved settings. Please refer to **Section 4.4.1** for further information.

Image Capture Button

Click Lostart your single image capturing.

If you are capturing a time-lapse sequence, the capturing progress will be displayed on the button. You can stop the time-lapse sequence capturing by clicking the button again.

Note The default image storage directory is C:\Users\your name\Documents\EzCapture.

4.2 Image View Mode

When you capture/open an image from the EzCapture software, the **Image View Mode** will be displayed. You can edit and analyze your image in this mode.

• Opened/Captured Image

It shows all your opened/captured images.

You can choose an opened/captured image to be shown in the Image Window.

Image Window

It shows the image you have opened (captured).

• Editing Panel

> Drawing Tool

Time-lapse Series Bar

If you capture the image under the Time-lapse setting, the Time-lapse Series tool will be enabled.

The number on the top right of the Time-lapse Series bar is the total number of captured images.

The number on the top left of the Time-lapse Series bar is the image showing in the Image Window.

To show a certain image, you can move the sliding bar or click on the left and right adjustment button <</th>. You can also fill in a number in the top left and press the "Enter" key to show the desired image.

Zoom

This tool provides digital zoom in/out for the image.

Brightness

This tool provides Brightness adjustment.

Contrast

This tool provides Contrast adjustment.

> Color

This tool provides Color adjustment.

White Balance

This tool allows you to adjust the color temperature of the image.

> Undo/Redo Event

This tool allows you to undo or redo your editing actions. Please note that undo actions will be cleared after you save the image file.




Figure 7. Image View Mode

4.3 Analysis

4.3.1 Time-lapse Photography

You can configure your time-lapse sequence capturing parameters here. EzCapture provides methods to allow you to set time-lapse image acquisition based on your experimental conditions.

Method:

Select **None** to capture a single image. This also disables all the other settings. Select **Image** to set the total image number for your time-lapse sequence. Select **Duration** to set the duration time for your time-lapse sequence capturing event.

• Start Date:

Set the starting date and time for your time-lapse capturing. Check the **Now** box to start

your capturing immediately after you click on the image capture button.

• Interval:

Set the time interval between each image capturing in your time-lapse sequence.

• Number:

If you select the **Image** method, you can set the total image number for your time-lapse sequence. The setting range is **1-999** images.

This setting option will be blocked when you select the **Duration** method, the total image number will be calculated by the software automatically.

• End Date:

The end date/time will be calculated by the software automatically according to your settings.

• Duration:

If you select **Duration** method, you can set the duration time for your time-lapse sequence.

This setting option will be blocked when you select **Image** method, the duration will be calculated by the software automatically.

4.3.2 Measurement




Figure 10. Measurement Tools

In **Image View Mode**, you can select **Analysis Menu>Measurement** in the tool bar (Figure 9). The tools for **Measurement** will be shown on the Control Panel (Figure 10).

Measurement Tool

This tool provides you to measure distance and area on the captured image.

Line Measurement

Select the icon to draw a linear line to measure linear distance on the captured image.

Rectangle Measurement

Select the icon to draw a rectangle to measure area on the captured image.

Ellipse Measurement

Select the icon to draw an ellipse to measure area on the captured image.

Freehand Measurement

Select the icon to draw a line freely to measure distance of the line on the captured image.

Measurement Scheme

Select the spatial calibration for the measurement.

• Measurement Items

The events of measurement will list in this area. When you select one of the events, the details of the measurement will be shown below.

When all the measurement settings are completed, click "Done" to finish editing.

4.3.3 Confluence

In Image View Mode, you can select Analysis Menu>Confluence in the tool bar. The tools for Confluence will be shown on the Control Panel.

Confluence Tools

These tools allow you to select a certain area for measuring confluence. You can use one of them to select an area you want to measure on the image. If you make no selection, the whole image area can be measured for confluence.

Rectangle

Select the icon to draw a rectangle to measure confluence of the area on the captured image.

> Ellipse

Select the icon to draw an ellipse to measure confluence of the area on the captured image.

Freehand

Select the icon to draw a freehand area to measure confluence of the area on the captured image.

Time-lapse Series

If you capture the image under the Time-lapse setting, the Time-lapse Series tool will be enabled.

The number on the top right is the total number of captured images.

The number on the top left is the image showing in the Image Window.

To show a certain image, you can move the sliding bar or click on the left and right adjustment button < >. You can also fill in a number in the top left and press the "Enter" key to show the desired image.

To delete a certain image, you can press **u** to delete the image.

- **Measurement Scheme** Select the spatial calibration for the measurement.
- Flat-Field Correction Correct an uneven background.
- Confluence Areas

If you use **Confluence Tools** to select a certain area for confluence analysis, areas will be shown at **Confluence Areas**.

When you select one of the areas, the details of the confluence analysis will show below.

• Threshold

Set the threshold setting for confluence. You can move the sliding bar or click on the left and right adjustment button $\triangleleft \triangleright$.

• Opacity

To adjust background opacity of the image, you can move the sliding bar or click on the left and right adjustment button

If all settings are completed, press "Done" to complete the Confluence analysis.




Figure 11. Confluence Analysis

4.4 System Setting

The System Menu allows you to review and change settings of EzScope. Press **System** on the Tool bar. All System settings are available under **Live View Mode**.




Figure 13. Camera Setting Panel

Select Camera and the setting panel will be shown.

You can select an EzScope device using the drop-down box when you are connected to multiple EzScope devices (one computer can connect to up to four devices). The selected device information will show on the panel.

Name: You can edit name of your EzScope device by typing in the box.

Path: Check the box to change save the path for images. If you uncheck the **Path** box, images will save at the default path.

Default: It shows the default save path for images.

• Brightness Reference

Set the brightness reference value for auto exposure detection.

Pixel Clock

Set the image refresh rate.

• Flat-Field Correction

Flat-field correction is an important technique used to remove variations and distortions from images due to an uneven light source.

- Place your vessel on the Sample Stage. In the Live View Mode, adjust Focus and Exposure of the image.
- 2. Uncheck Auto box of the Exposure to disable the function.
- 3. Remove the vessels on the **Sample Stage**.
- 4. Click on the Flat-Field Correction button and a dialog box will appear.
- 5. Enter the frame number you want to capture.
- 6. Click on the "Capture" button, EzScope will capture the images.
- 7. Click on the "Apply" button to apply captured images.
- 8. Click on the "Done" button to complete the correction.

REMOVE vessels on the Sample Stage BEFORE operate Flat-field correction

4.4.2 Changing Lens

REMOVE vessels or any objects on the sample stage BEFORE changing the objective lens. EzScope has 10x and 20x objective lens that can be exchanged.

- 1. To change the objective lens, select **Change Lens**. The setting panel will be shown.
- 2. Select a device you want to change the objective lens for from the drop-down box, and click the "**Change**" button.
- 3. A dialog box will appear asking you to **REMOVE** vessels from the sample stage. Click the "OK" button after removing all vessels.
- 4. The lens will rise automatically.
- 5. Rotate the lens counter-clockwise to remove it.
- 6. Rotate the new lens clockwise to install it.
- 7. Click the "OK" button on the dialog box, then the installed new lens will return to the home position in the bottom.
- 8. Click on the "Done" button to complete the lens change.

This mode is for servicing purposes only.

5 Remote Monitoring

EzCapture is a Windows based application. 6 Maintenance

6.1 Cleaning the Unit

The EzScope 101 requires minimal cleaning. Please unplug the power cable before cleaning. Clean the device with a lint free cloth or Kimwipe[™] soaked with 70% ethanol.

Note

- 1. Do not use acetone to clean the device or autoclave the device.
- 2. Please avoid using too much ethanol solution that may leak into the machine.

6.2 Cleaning the LED Lamp Arm

Make sure the EzScope 101 is unplugged and the LED Lamp Arm has been removed from the EzScope 101. Clean the LED Lamp and LED Lamp Arm with a lint free cloth or Kimwipe[™] soaked with 70% ethanol.

Note

Do not use acetone to clean the LED Lamp (Arm) or autoclave the LED Lamp (Arm).

6.3 Cleaning the Lens

Remove the Lens from the EzScope 101. Use a blower to remove dust particles on the lens if necessary. Drop 1 to 2 drops of 70% ethanol on lens tissue to wipe the Lens. Wipe the lens in a circular path from the center to the edge of the lens.

Note

- 1. Do not use acetone to clean the Lens or autoclave the Lens.
- 2. Do not spray or drop 70% ethanol directly on the Lens.
