## **SECTION 4: First aid measures**

## 4.1 Description of first aid measures

### General advice:

First aider needs to protect himself. Move out of dangerous area. Take off all contaminated clothing immediately. If unconscious, place in recovery position and seek medical advice.

Inhalation:

Remove to fresh air. Keep patient warm and at rest. Call a physician immediately.

#### Skin contact:

### 5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Vapours may form explosive mixtures with air. Vapours are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Vapors may travel to areas away from work site before igniting/flashing back to vapor source. In case of fire hazardous decomposition products may be produced such as: Carbon monoxide Carbon dioxide (CO2)

### 5.3. Advice for firefighters

In the event of fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus.

No unprotected exposed skin areas.

Use extinguishing measures that are appropriate to local circumstances and the surrounding environment.Collect contaminated fire extinguishing water separately. This must not be discharged into drains.Do not use a solid water stream as it may scatter and spread fire.

## 7.1. Precautions for safe handling

Advice on safe handling: Exhaust ventilation at the object is necessary.

Advice on protection against fire and explosion:

Keep away from sources of ignition - No smoking. Take measures to prevent the build up of electrostatic charge. The heavy vapours can overcome a considerable distance up to the source of ignition. Vapours may form explosive mixtures with air.

*Hygiene measures:* General industrial hygiene practice.

Requirements for storage areas and containers: Store in original container. Keep container tightly closed in a dry and well-ventilated place. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Keep away from direct sunlight.

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## 8.2. Exposure controls

### **Occupational exposure controls**

The Personal Protective Equipment must be in accordance with EN standards:respirator EN 136, 140, 149; safety glasses EN 166; protective suit: EN 340, 463, 468, 943-1, 943-2; gloves EN 374, 511; safety shoes EN-ISO 20345.

Ensure that eyewash stations and safety showers are close to the workstation location. Avoid breathing vapours, mist or gas.
